The Michael H. Flanagan Foundation was established by the Flanagan family in 2002 in memory of this young man, who at the age of 19 was diagnosed with leukemia. Michael strived to live his life with courage, integrity and faith during his three and a half year struggle with leukemia which included two bone marrow transplants. He received the very best in medical and nursing care at both The Miriam Hospital in Rhode Island and the Tufts Medical Center in Boston.

Bone Marrow transplant patients spend weeks and sometimes months in isolation while they struggle with complications and wait for their new immune system to develop. After witnessing Michael's time in the hospital, his family decided to establish this foundation as a way to keep his memory alive and to support other patients facing the same difficult journey. It is the mission of the Foundation to provide comfort to these patients and their families during this very challenging time.

Each time a newly diagnosed leukemia patient is admitted to begin their treatment they receive a MHFF Comfort Bag. Our population that we serve is 18 + however we customize for pediatrics whenever we are asked. We reached our 15 year mark this May! We are proud to report that over 1300 Bags have been opened and those lives made a little more comfortable while undergoing treatment. We have added adult coloring books ,colored pencils and Queasy pop lollipops and are always researching new ideas, products and potential donations. When I received your package and check it made me cry. I wasn't expecting that from anyone. You have no idea what that check means to me paying my monthly insurance payment. (Thank you-so very much!)The gift package was great. My family and I went through it 2-3 times. The gifts were purpose for the person (me). Spent a lot of time doing the coloring book, will send you a few pictures. Want to send you the very best ones.

Like your model Courage, (Strength- I added this one) Integrity and Faith. You have enhanced this patients goal and enhanced my quality of life. Your foundation is both awesome and incredible.

Sadly James lost his battle and we were so sorry to hear that after we received this beautiful letter of thanks and appreciation. I thought it was important to share this letter with all of you as that is truly who the letter is meant for.

April 19, 2017

I just wanted to say thank you. When I was 20, I was diagnosed with leukemia. Stuck in a hospital room for forty days, it was lonely and trying and painful. The treatments that followed my release were just as exhaustive.

While I was inpatient, I received a care package from the Michael H. Flanagan Foundation. It was an important gesture that I can't express the value of. Essential creature comforts that meant so much to me. When I was in an environment that was so sterile and lacking privacy to the point of becoming alienated from my own experiences. These comforts grounded me. I remember them well. I still use the hat I received. I filled up the notebook I was given. There was a turtle filled with sand, a little toy that even at 20 years old was a grounding anchor to what I was going through. I still have it. It still means the world to me.

Thank you for giving me physical comfort when I was at my most uncomfortable. Thank you for the foothold to emotional recovery. Thank you for everything you do. I'm now 22 and cancer free. But this Foundation holds a special place in my heart, and always will.
